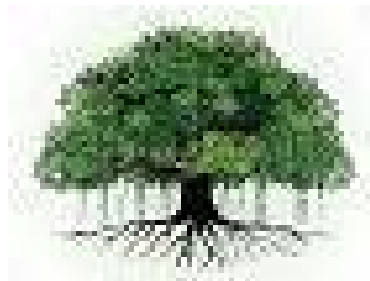

1.4.College fees were funded to 11 deserving students (including 9 medical and 2 arts college students)

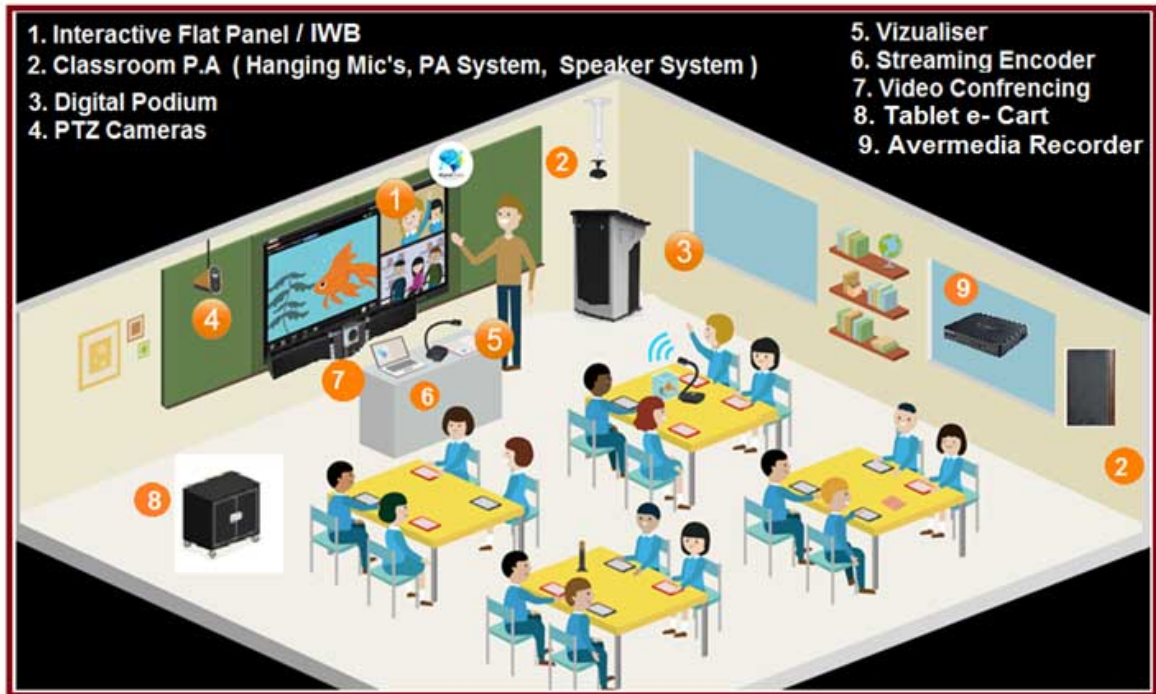


1.5.Medical supplies were provided to doctors of Government Royapettah hospital and KMCH including PPE kits, N95 masks, surgical masks and face shield.

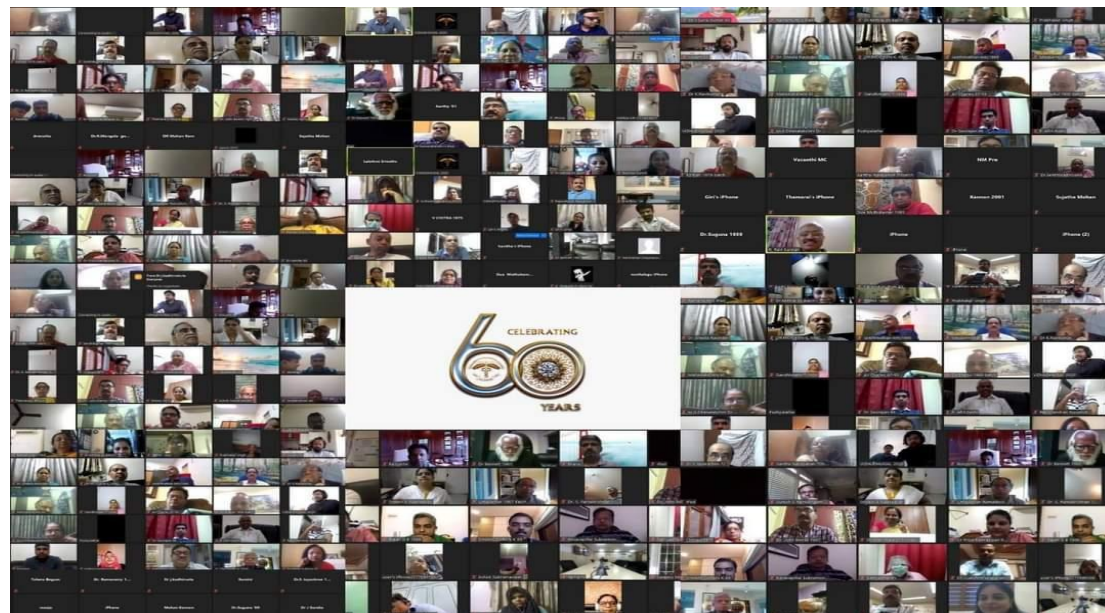
Apart from this, NEET aspirants from Trichy government school were also given training materials.
